I Receved on wensdaye R. h. Lord, this lre inclosed, & have this mornyng writte[n] unto, makyng honorable mencyon of your L. therin. I wolld putt yow in remembrance [ ... ] disposed to employe me in Holland, to effect that purpose which ye brake with me of, [ ... ] willeng withall mi skyll & diligence to obey yow, wherfore I wolld humbly be re[ ... ] your L. plesure on that behallf. And Herewith I humbly beseke yow to move mi [1 word expunged] favorably on mi behallf, withowt whose furtherance I shalbe never hable to pr[ ... ] advance, & in lyke sorte mi sute is, that ye will wyn master secretory to ass[ ... ] & prefferment for your L. sake, seyng that for yow only, I am kept back & mos[ ... ] with her majestie which difficultye yf I shalbe hable this waye to overcom your L. shall [ ... ] the good & faythfyll service, that I will do yow. & ye shall increse the good will of[ ... ] (in my case) towards yow. /

The v^th^ of January. 1587. Temple Barre your L. most humbly W. Herlleli.
