[fol. 99r] mi R. worshipfull good cosyn, I do bere in mynde, how muche I am beholldyng to yow, and will nott cesse (besyde mi thanckfullnes for the same) tyll [1 word expunged] I make yow som amends, desireng yow in the mene tyme, that yow possesse that ynterest in me to be perswaded that the interest yow have in me is suche, as that you may use & comande me, as [forefurth] nether fryndship nor kynred shall go before me, in expressyng how muche I desire to be yowrs, whom I love & respect for the vallew that is in yow, a grownd worck that is apte to byllde faste uppon./ When the sute was made here for the Recevyng of ^that^ your accomptes ^might be Receved^ att home, I tolld master Secretory Wallsyngham your merites & masterjustice, & mynde grett mynde, ^towards the state^ & whatt further I suppresse, who conffirmed ^agayn^ that yow were worthy of ani favor, & was most willeng ether in this or other matter, to be your mediator hym sellf./ I mene shortly sir to be yn the Contrey & to discowrse with yow (yf your disposityon will permitt it) of a nomber of things, & namely of drakes circuityon of the worlld, a man that made hym [1 word expunged] sellf herby famous & is to [brave] & wherof our kyngdom is to Receve ynffinite comodytye. Herewith, havyng the comoditye of this bere mi frynd & kynseman I do send yow ynclosed ij papers
